SHOUTBOMB TIP OF THE MONTH

Sometimes patrons who are registered for Shoutbomb get a new phone number. They don't always remember to update their Shoutbomb accounts with their new numbers so, when the old phone number is re-issued to another person, that person receives the former person's messages. When this happens, the person who is now in possession of that number can simply text the word STOP to the messages. This will delete the Shoutbomb account and they will no longer receive the other person's messages.

MODIFICATIONS TO DAMAGED ITEM PROCEDURE

When your library receives a damaged item that does not belong to your library, before returning it to the owning library, you must contact the patron who returned the item to you to let them know that the item was damaged when it was returned and that you are sending it back to the owning library for evaluation. Then place the item in delivery with the green transfer slip and a note to the owning library. The owning library is still responsible for determining the charge amount for damaged items.


The Lakeland Board sign a letter and shared it with ALA for their campaign. There is a possible **change** for consortia advantage purchases. Announcements are expected very soon.

MEMBER HIGHLIGHTS WHAT'S HAPPENING AT YOUR LIBRARY?



Fennville District Library: In August, we had a week of art fun and learning with Art Camp Revival that was geared towards youth ages 6-11. Our talented staff, some of whom are artists themselves, came up with a different project and curriculum for each day. Monday- students used oil pastels to explore expressionism via the world of Edvard Munch and his most notable piece, "The Scream." Tuesday- they learned about Alexander Calder and sculpted their own interpretation of kinetic art using toothpick squares. Wednesday- students experienced a century old process come to life when they created their own prints with the etching printmaking technique. Thursday- we braved the mess and used charcoal to sketch our live student models, after learning about Rembrandt and his use of figure drawing. Friday-we celebrated all of the young artists by holding an art show and reception!

Fruitport District Library: On August 21, our board unanimously voted to no longer charge overdue fines on our juvenile and teen materials. This change in policy took effect September 3 with the other libraries of Muskegon County. Board members recognized that overdue fines act as a barrier to youth obtaining books, because either they or their parents do not have the money to pay the fines, or they or their parents are embarrassed by returning materials late. We are excited to join other libraries in the Cooperative in this effort to keep our library's media in youths' hands.



Georgetown Township Public Library: We will be closed over the next couple weeks to move into our new library. We plan to reopen on Monday, October 21.

Grand Rapids Public Library: "Come celebrate Día de los Muertos with the Grand Rapids Public Library. Day of the Dead is a Mexican holiday that honors family and friends who have passed on. Loved ones come together to build altars that celebrate the life and memory of the dead. This is a time of celebration and joy, filled with talk and memories of those who have died. Altars from members of the community honoring family and friends will be on display. Every altar is unique and taken together they create a fascinating portrait of what citizens of Grand Rapids hold close to them. Free and open to the public."

Muskegon Area District Library: This October, the Muskegon County Oral Health Coalition rolls out "iSmile Muskegon" with Muskegon Area District Library. The partnership between the Muskegon County Oral Health Coalition (MOHC) and MADL is made possible by a \$5000 grant provided by the Mars Wrigley Company Foundation. The grant includes training for library staff in oral health education, programming, materials, an oral health book collection, and MOHC staff present at programs to assist with education.

Each MADL branch has a Rethink Your Drink display. Patrons can also attend a presentation or read an iSmile display book and learn how xylitol helps prevent cavities. Special Storytimes will be held at all branches in October. Patrons will be invited to fill out a survey after any one of these activities and receive a free oral health goody bag. One winner will be drawn from all surveys completed at each branch to receive a power toothbrush or a water flosser.

"Your Smile is What You Eat and Drink," by iSmile Muskegon will be held at the Norton Shores, North Muskegon, and Ravenna branches. This program helps to identify the sugar, pH, and bacteria that is a danger to your healthy smile and what you can do to protect your teeth. Attendees will discover the over-the-counter products, food, and drinks that will help you keep your smile for a lifetime.



Spring Lake District Library: Book Club in a Bag kits are holdable for patrons of other libraries and can go in delivery. Each kit comes with 10 paperback books. The list of titles we have are on Encore if you search for "sldl book club in a bag".



Tamarack District Library: We hosted 21 vendors and had over 100 people attend our Health Expo on August 21st from 4-6 pm. This was held in the Tamarack Room and the Library's own Pam Feutz organized this well attended event. Our TDL Friends of the Library provided money for pens that we placed in goodie bags. This enabled our attendees to collect their loot from the health fair vendors. We were told it was fun and that it was like "Trick or Treating" for adults. We have already scheduled our next Health Expo for August 19th, 2020.
